1. Find and copy three Bible verses used in this book which support homeschooling. Then write them again, in your own words, verse by verse. What do they mean? Why do they support homeschooling? How will you apply them in your life? Write at least 3 sentences about the meaning of each of the verses.
2. What is the true goal of education? How does traditional schooling not meet this goal? How can homeschooling, when done in a non-traditional way, meet this goal? What is the difference between "schooling" and "education?" (not in the book—just think it through)
3. What is the world's view of success? What is God's view? What do you want for your life?
4. Name three myths of education. Describe why they are myths and what the truth is.
5. God gives you natural interests and gifts, or talents. Make a list of things you are interested in, or naturally do well at, or that you just love. Could any of these be developed into a life calling, ministry, or job?
6. Make a list of things you would like to know more about, either now or someday. Then list ways you can learn about them, using suggestions in the book.
7. Describe the story of David and Solomon told at the end of the book. How does this relate to homeschooling?
8. What do you think notebooking is? How is it a valuable educational tool?

9. For what reasons is college necessary? When is it unnecessary? What is the world's view of college?
